Trips and Events

The photographer will be in school on Tuesday 18th September to take individual photographs of all children from Years 1 to 6. If any child in Reception

class was absent when they had theirs done on Monday 10th September, they will take these too.

On Friday 28th September, the children will be inviting you to take part in the Macmillan Coffee Morning (or afternoon, in our case) and offering you delicious cakes to purchase in aid of this fantastic charity, which touches almost all our lives. A letter will be sent out shortly with details.

Letters have once again gone out to the children in Year 6 for our annual weekend trip to Boreatton Park in Shropshire in June 2019. This is an amazing opportunity for our children, but please consider carefully before reserving a place whether you have a family holiday booked which may clash, as the deposit is non-refundable. Places need to be booked by end of school on Friday 28th September after which any spare places will be offered to Year 5 children.

Attendance

Attendance last year was very disappointing with many parents taking their children out of school during term time on unauthorised holiday. Can we remind parents that, from 1st September 2018, the criteria for issuing a penalty notice was reduced and a fine will be considered where a pupil has had 10 sessions (equivalent of five days - consecutive or otherwise) of unauthorised absence over the period of two consecutive half terms, and we are monitoring this daily. An education is the finest gift we can give to our children, and we cannot stress enough the importance of children being in school each day, on time. Please help us, and your child, by ensuring that their attendance remains at a minimum of 96% (green) to allow them to achieve their full potential. School Matters ... if your child Attends Today, they will Achieve Tomorrow.

If you have any concerns about your child's attendance and wish to discuss this with the school, Mrs Hardman, our attendance officer, is available each Thursday by appointment.

Dinner Monies & School Trips

The dinner monies for this half term can be paid as follows: £7 per week or £49 which will cover from 3rd September until 19th October 2018. If paying weekly could you please make sure that this is paid each

Monday and put in a clearly marked envelope with your child's name and class written on. We do accept payment straight into the school bank account. If you wish to pay this way please contact Miss Maxwell on 01204 323375 for details, or call into the school office for the information. If dinner monies are not paid on time and go into arrears please be aware that your child will have to go onto packed lunches until this is paid off.

When your child receives a letter regarding a school trip, the money will now need to be paid directly to their class teacher along with the completed reply slip. Please make sure that this is also put in an envelope with their name and class clearly marked on the front. Envelopes can be purchased from the school office.

Snack

Here at St. Bede, the children in Years 1 to 6 have the option to purchase weekly snack by paying £1.50 on a **Monday** to their class teacher. Children in Years 3 to 6 also have the opportunity to purchase a daily snack item from the kitchen during their morning break for 20p.

For those children who choose not to pay for school snack, they may bring in an item from home (from the agreed list below):

- Yogurts in a tube e.g. 'Frubes'
- Fresh fruit
- Dried fruit
- Individual rice cakes (no packets please)
- · Crackers and cheese
- Vegetable sticks
- Cheese triangles/individual cheese blocks
- Breadsticks

We are continuing to take part in the Government initiative to provide all infants with free fruit and vegetables during the day; this means a free fruit or vegetable snack will be offered to children in Years 1 and 2. Unfortunately Key Stage 2 children do not receive free fruit or vegetables.

Learning Mentor

This year Mrs O'Brien has taken on a new role as learning mentor. Her role is to inspire and motivate children and act as a role model to encourage respectful relationships. She is also a good listener and can offer support with changes in behaviour, developing and maintaining friendships, low self-esteem and confidence, parents/carer support with routine and managing behaviour at home,

Lost Property

Lost property orange boxes are situated outside the hall behind the red curtain and on the Reception corridor. Please feel free to check these boxes often. Any clearly named items will always be returned to your child and once a term we allow children to take any unwanted items home for free.

We appreciate that sometimes parents may be upset about something that has happened in school, and we kindly ask that our staff are spoken to in a civil and respectful manner when discussing things, and NEVER in front of the children or on social media sites; children quickly pick up on negativity between parents and staff and are only too quick to emulate it. Two of the seven values which we teach our children are Kindness and Respect and we ask that parents also observe and demonstrate these values to children and to staff. Thank you.
