



Pupil Privacy Notice

Why do we collect and use pupil information?

We collect and process pupil information under the following lawfulness of processing personal data

- Article 6a – Consent to processing data for one or more specific purpose
- Article 6c Compliance with legal obligations, which the controller is subject to
- Examples of these include obligations placed on the school/academy by the DfE include (More information on these can be found at <https://www.gov.uk/education/data-collection-and-censuses-for-schools>)
 - Attendance
 - SEND
 - Progress and Attainment
 - Safeguarding
- Article 6d – in order to protect the vital interests of the data subject or of a natural living person
- We also collect and process data under Article 9 – Processing of special categories of personal data
 - Where we have explicit consent
 - To protect vital interests of the data subject

We use the pupil data:

- to support pupil learning
- to monitor and report on pupil progress
- to provide appropriate pastoral care
- to assess the quality of our services
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing
- to safeguard pupils

The categories of pupil information that we collect, hold and share include:

- Personal information (such as name, unique pupil number and address)
- Contact information (such as parents, carers and guardians)
 - The parent email address for correspondence is used in order to maintain an additional line of communication with parents/carers to ensure better interaction. This will enable us to share newsletters and other information about school organisation and events.
- Characteristics (such as ethnicity, language, nationality, country of birth and free school meal eligibility)
- Attendance information (such as sessions attended, number of absences and absence reasons)
- Medical information (such as allergies, ongoing medical needs)
- SEND & behaviour information
- Safeguarding information
- Assessment data
- Pupil images and videos

Collecting pupil information

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing pupil data

Most pupil data is stored in the cloud on either Bromcom or OTrack. Access to these systems is in accordance with the Access Control Policy. In accordance with the MAT's Data Protection Policy any 3rd party data processors have data sharing agreements in place.

We keep pupil data for the period of time identified in our retention policy.

Who do we share pupil information with?

We routinely share pupil information with:

- schools including those within the cluster, multi academy trust and those that the pupil's attend after leaving us
- St Bede's Childcare Limited
- local authority
- Outreach support services
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- services in health and social care
- Police
- Trustees, Directors, Members, LGB/LAB and other stakeholders
- OFSTED / HMI

Data collection requirements:

The National Pupil Database (NPD)

The NPD is owned and managed by the Department for Education and contains information about pupils in schools in England. It provides invaluable evidence on educational performance to inform independent research, as well as studies commissioned by the Department. It is held in electronic format for statistical purposes. This information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and awarding bodies.

We are required by law, to provide information about our pupils to the DfE as part of statutory data collections such as the school census and early years census. Some of this information is then stored in the NPD. The law that allows this is the Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

The department may share information about our pupils from the NPD with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children in England by:

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- conducting research or analysis
- producing statistics
- providing information, advice or guidance

The Department has robust processes in place to ensure the confidentiality of our data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access and use of the data. Decisions on whether DfE releases data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data
- the purpose for which it is required
- the level and sensitivity of data requested: and
- the arrangements in place to store and handle the data

To be granted access to pupil information, organisations must comply with strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation parents and pupils over the age of 13 have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, or be given access to your child's educational record, contact the St Bede C of E Primary Multi Academy Trust senior leadership team.

You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
