

SCHOOL RE-OPENING SEPTEMBER 2020

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

(updated 21st August 2020)

The symptoms of Coronavirus

New continuous cough

Fever

Loss or a change in your normal sense of smell or taste

1. [What measures have been put in place to ensure all children and staff are safe when school reopens in September?](#)

Our normal safeguarding procedures are in place. There are signs around the school to remind staff and children what they need to do to protect themselves whilst in school. Children will watch video guidance on how to stay safe within school; hand-sanitisers have been placed around the school at key entrances; children will be encouraged to wash their hands at key points during the day; cleaning will take place throughout the day. 2. [I don't feel comfortable sending my child back to school full-time, will I get fined if my child doesn't attend school?](#)

The Government has stated that all children are required, by law, to return to school in September and therefore attendance will be monitored and action taken where necessary for any unauthorised absence.

3. [I don't feel comfortable sending my child back to school full-time and I will provide home-schooling, can the school arrange for regular work to be sent home; will my child lose their place?](#)

If you do not feel comfortable sending your child to school due to medical reasons, please phone the school to request an individual risk assessment for your child. The staff will do their best to ensure that it is safe for your child to return, and this will be completed with your support. Please provide medical evidence from a medical professional if it is unsafe for your child to return to school. The school will then put together a package of home learning for your child.

4. [If a member of our household is shielding, can my child still attend school?](#)

Yes, your child can still attend school.

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5. [If my child is unable to attend school due to a COVID related reason, will the school arrange for regular work to be sent home?](#)

If your child is unwell, we would not expect them to complete work as we would want them to make a full recovery. If your child needs to isolate as a member of the family is displaying symptoms, but they are well, please contact the school and leave a message for the class teacher, they will provide work for your child to complete remotely.

6. [My child is eligible to Free School Meals \(FSM\). If my child is unable to attend school due to a COVID related reason, will they still receive FSM vouchers?](#)

Unfortunately, the FSM voucher scheme ends before the next academic year so we will not be able to provide vouchers.

7. [What happens if a child or a member of staff displays symptoms of COVID whilst at school?](#)

If a child displays symptoms their adult will be contacted and asked to collect their child from school immediately. Adults are asked to wait outside and a member of staff will bring their child to them. Adults should then arrange to get their child tested and a leaflet will be handed out explaining the procedure. If the test is negative the child may return back to school; if it is a positive test the child must isolate for 14 days with the family. We will also contact parents of children who were attending the same class and they will have to do the same.

The same procedure will apply to a member of staff. They will be asked to leave school immediately and must arrange to get tested.

8. [How regularly is the school cleaned?](#)

The school has received a full deep clean over the summer holidays. The school will be cleaned every evening and each lunchtime. Desks and surfaces will be cleaned throughout the day.

9. [How and where will break-times and lunch-times take place to adhere to the Government guidelines on social distancing and children remaining in classes/bubbles?](#)

Children will still have the same amount of break-times within the school day. However, children will take breaks with a 'year group bubble'. Classes have been assigned an area of the yard to play in during break-times. During lunchtime, the pupils will need to take half of their break-time in the classroom (like a wet break-time) and half of their break-time outside. In terms of dining, hot dinners will be taken in the hall, packed lunches will be taken in the classrooms. This is to support social distancing and to ensure that each class can access a separate area of the yard.

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10. Will my child have to wear school uniform?

Yes, all children will be required to wear school uniform.

11. What can my child bring with them to school?

Please ensure children do not bring any toys to school. They can bring a water bottle, small bag, P.E. bag, coat and packed lunch (unless they access school dinners). In rainy weather pupils may bring wellington boots into school, in a labelled bag.

12. How will parents remain a two metre distance apart when dropping off/collecting children from school?

We ask parents to be responsible and keep a 2 metre distance from one another. We have painted boxes outside each entrance to maintain social distancing when dropping pupils off at the classroom doors. We no longer want pupils to line up on the yard before school. We will leave entrance doors open to encourage a free flow of pupils into school from 8:45 – 9:00am, and will start releasing pupils from 3:00 – 3:15pm to avoid parents congregating on the yard.

13. My child was off school poorly prior to lock down and I didn't get chance to collect their P.E. Kit, where will this be now?

This, along with other items such as coats etc., will still be in school and will be available at the lost property area, situated on the decking in the new build area. Parents can come and collect items from Tuesday 1st - Friday 4th September and entrance is via the main school gates. **Parents MUST NOT enter the school building to collect items from classrooms.** Any items which are not collected by the end of the week will be disposed of.

14. Children will be starting a new year group with a new teacher and would normally have had an introductory morning before they broke up for the summer holidays. With there being such a long period off school, will there be an introductory session for both children and parents?

The first week of school will be dedicated to settling the children into school both emotionally and socially. Unfortunately, we will not be able to hold our 'Meet the Teacher' evenings. However, teachers will still create a presentation and a link to this will be emailed to you so that you can watch this in the safety of your own home.

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15. My child has asthma. Can they return to school in September and how safe will it be for children who have respiratory conditions?

Yes they can, unless they have a medical note from a medical professional to say that they must remain at home. Please contact the school if you would like us to create an individual risk assessment for your child.

16. What arrangements will be put in place for seating in the classroom to ensure social distancing?

Desks in classrooms in Years 3 to 6 will be put in rows. All children will be educated about keeping a safe distance.

17. How will teachers manage the washing area and control the children?

Handwashing has been timetabled throughout the day. There are also hand sanitising stations throughout the school that children will use at certain points throughout the day. If your child has sensitive skin they can bring their own products in, but they must take responsibility for keeping these products safe and must not share with other pupils.

18. What size classes/bubbles will the children be in?

Class bubbles include 30 pupils and year group bubbles include 90 pupils.

19. Will there be a bigger window of time for children to be dropped off and collected to and from school?

Yes, pupils can be dropped off from 8:45 - 9:00am and collected from 3:00 – 3:15pm.

20. Will the children be back to school full-time; is there an option for my child to return part-time?

Children must return full-time unless they have previously accessed the school part-time due to their additional needs as identified by the SENDCO.

21. Will children need to wear face masks/coverings?

No, children of 11 years old and under are not required to wear facemasks. It would be very uncomfortable for pupils to wear these all day and we want pupils to feel comfortable in their learning environment. If children decide to wear facemasks on the journey to school, these must be safely packed away on arrival to school.

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22. How are you going to keep children apart in a class of 30 with not much spare room in classrooms?

Unfortunately, we cannot guarantee that we can keep children apart at all times. We can only educate children about staying safe during COVID. We want children to feel comfortable and happy at school. We will use all spaces available (as usual) to educate pupils.

23. On the days children have P.E., do they come to school in their P.E. kits or do they change at school as normal?

Children in classes who have their P.E. lesson first on the timetable will be asked to come into school in their P.E. kit, then change into their uniform. Classes who have P.E. later in the day will change into their P.E. kits in school, before their lesson commences. A communication will be sent out to the classes who have P.E. first on the timetable, during the first week of term.
